
Coach A. P. Serge, head and line coach, and Coach Jack Powers, backfield coach, back from last year, did not have as successful a team as the 1946 team.

Hunter Booth and R. B. Young led the backfield and Herby Wright, Jack Beaver and Joe McLendon led the line for the 1947 season.


The season's record 4 wins, 5 losses and 1 tie.





Cradock High's "Little Admirals," under the capable coaching of Jack Veazie, had a very successful season on the gridiron this year. They boast a season record of 7 wins and one loss, a near perfect season. Opening the season against Norview the J. V.'s came through with a well deserved 7-0 victory with Simons scoring on a pass from Overman. Next to go down before the "Veazie coached lads" was the power laden J. V. from South Norfolk 13-6, with Cradock's line playing a bang-up defensive game, Co-Captains Keever and Overman looking best on the line and Spies and Wood being the standouts in the Cradock backfield. The Admirals snowed Oceana under 28-6 with quarterback Wood and halfback Spies showing the way. Returning to home grounds the Cradock boys suffered a bad day and went down fighting to Suffolk 13-7, their first and only loss of the season.

Cradock invaded Norview, which was by now a vastly improved team, but nevertheless the "Little Admirals" came through with flying colors by a convincing margin of 27-13, Agee and Wood putting the game on ice with two last quarter touchdowns. In the following week powerful Class A Granby marched on the field, confident of a win over the Maroon and Gold but were sadly mistaken as Spies came through with two touchdowns and two extra points on his own, leading Cradock to a 14-0 win over the Comets. Peterson also turned in a brilliant defensive game as did Story and the entire Cradock line. Having virtually clinched the Norfolk County Championship, Coach Veazie started getting his team ready for Oceana in a return game, set for the following week. Cradock evidently was ready, taking Oceana in stride 20:0. With Spies and Agee leading the way, Cradock clinched the Championship by closing out the season with a 13-0 win over South Norfolk.



Defending the District I, Group 2 Championship, the Admirals got off to a slow start, but finished the season with another tournament berth, defeating Morrison in the Semi-finals 35-31. Playing Suffolk in the finals, found the Admirals beaten by only two points. At the half time the Suffolk Red Raiders had an edge of 18-9 over the Admirals. The second half got under way and the Admirals began to click, but as the clock ran out Suffolk still had a two point lead over the Admirals. Final score, Suffolk 30, Cradock 28. The Suffolk Red Raiders' were the only team to win over Cradock on Cradock's own court in 2 years. Season's record—15 wins and 6 losses.







The consolidation of Alexander Park and Cradock High Schools brought together the remaining members of two of the strongest teams in Norfolk County and Group II Competition.


As a result of this consolidation and constant practice a basketball team working as a single unit was developed.

The Cradock "Admiraletts" came through an exciting season, capturing the Norfolk County Championship, winning seven games and tied one.




